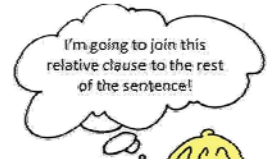


Relative Pronouns

Relative pronouns get their name because a relative pronoun “relates” to the word it is modifying. You can use a relative pronoun to link a relative clause to another part of a sentence. The relative pronoun has the job of introducing the relative clause.
